Wellbeing Day

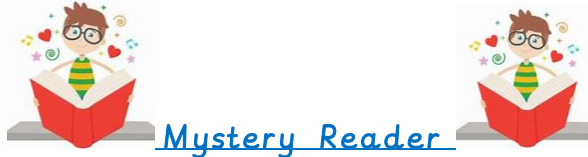
