Please ensure earrings are removed and long hair is tied back.

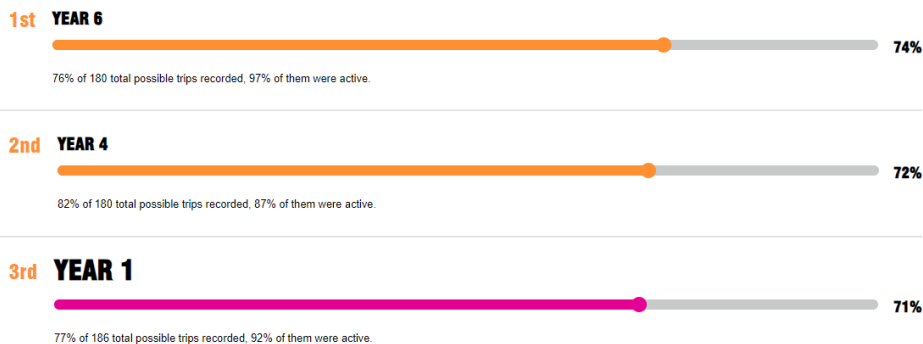
