Science Week 21st March 2022

From Monday 21st March until Friday 25th March we will be celebrating British Science Week across school. As part of this, there will be many different activities that the children will be participating in linked to this year's theme of 'Growth'.

Professor Bubbles Showcase

On Wednesday 23rd March, we have organised for Professor Bubbles to visit school and showcase a variety of different 'Wow' science investigations themed around the concept of growth. Each child will be able to experience the awe and wonder of science and compare what they think will happen to what actually happens and why this may be the case.

Whole School Investigation

Throughout the week, each class will take part in an experiment to identify patterns in how humans grow as they increase in age. They will be using their measuring skills to observe and record different body parts to identify any patterns they may see and then research why this may be the case. We are all very excited about completing a whole school project! We are all looking forward to immersing ourselves in science throughout the week and having the opportunity to further explore the different aspects of science through investigative activities.
