On Friday 4th March, we will be celebrating 'World Book Day' across school. Over the course of the day there will be a range of activities that promote a love of reading for the children to engage with.

This year, our theme for the event is 'All About Books'. Therefore, we are wanting all of the activities on the day to be centred around developing children's love of reading. Throughout the day, children will explore the work of the poet Michael Rosen, take part in reading challenges, listen to a range of teachers sharing stories and have 'juice and biscuit' during whole school Storytime. **Please supply your child with an additional drink to have during this time, labelled with their name (no fizzy drinks please).**

We appreciate that this is a difficult time for many people so we have decided to keep the costume theme simple.
